Luggage

It is required that Scouts and Adults traveling to Summer Camp not check luggage at the airport. This is for three reasons

- There is an extra cost to check bags at the airport: both departing from Houston and returning from Colorado Springs (this is not included in fees already paid)
- Recovering luggage will take extra time when we arrive
- There is free luggage handling via Troop 230

Alan Grimsley and John Rebeck will be driving to and from Summer Camp. They will haul the large scout trailer. Bring your camping gear and non-essential luggage (clothes, sundry items, camping gear) to the Scout House on Tuesday, June 22, 2010, 6:30pm. We will load everyone's camping gear in the trailer along with troop gear. Please mark your calendar for this date. Remember, Mr. Rebeck and Mr. Grimsley will be leaving the next day, so there isn't a second chance to load items later. We will be reviewing the preparation checklist at the June 7 meeting.

It is OK to take on a carry-on bag, however make sure you following the TSA guidelines listed under the Airline Travel section of this email.

Leaving from Houston to Colorado Springs

We are requiring each scout arrive at Intercontinental Airport two (2) hours before departure. We will need the time to get organized. Here is our flight information.

Please arrive at Terminal E, Group Check In by 7:20 am. I will be waiting for you close to the group check in and will have your boarding pass. You will not be able to check in online 24 hours before.

Your scouts (under 18 years of age) will be able to go through security with their boarding pass. No ID is necessary for those under the age of 18.

Return to Houston from Colorado Springs

As you see above, scouts and adults will arrive back in Houston Saturday, July 2, 2010 at 5:22 pm. If you are picking someone up at the airport, we recommend you pick them up in Terminal B Baggage Claim area, close to the Private Passenger Car pick up. I and other scout leaders will remain at the airport until all scouts have been picked up.

Proper Clothing for the traveling to and from Houston/Colorado Springs /Air Force Academy/Camp Alexander

It is required by Boy Scouts of America, registered Scouts and Adults must wear their Class A shirt from the time they leave their home until we arrive Air Force Academy. It will also be required that those individuals wear their Class A from Camp Alexander back to their home on July 3. This is not optional.

There will be some waiting time, so please bring a book or other materials to keep scouts occupied. Merit badge pamphlets would be a good choice as well.

Bus Transportation

Troop 230 hired a Bus Company, Metropolitan Shuttle Services, to transport our troop from the Colorado Springs airport to the Garden of the Gods, Air Force Academy, Pikes Peak Cog Railway, Camp Alexander, and from Camp Alexander back to the Colorado airport. We will discuss the details with the scouts and adults prior to arriving to the Colorado Springs airport.

MEDICATIONS

Under Colorado State Law, any Scouts bringing medication to camp, including herbal supplements must adhere to the following procedures. **All medication and herbal supplements must be checked in at the Health Lodge and will be made available by the Camp's medical staff. This includes all over-the-counter medications. i.e. aspirin, Tylenol, etc. We ask however that you do not send these medications to camp as we have them available at the Health Lodge. Any adult bringing medication must secure and lock their medication.**



All medications and herbal supplements, whether prescription or over-the-counter **MUST be in the original container with the prescription attached, marked with the campers name and Troop number.** Please do not cover-up information and instructions on the medication. A letter or prescription from a licensed medical practitioner (MD, DO, PA-C or RNP) must accompany the vitamins or herbal remedies with the name of the camper, the type of vitamins or herbal remedies, the dosage and the times of dispensing. If these requirements are not met, the vitamins or herbal remedies will not be made available and will be placed in a locked container in the Health Lodge and will be returned to the troop leader at the end of the week.

It is the responsibility of the adult leaders to ensure that Scouts are taking their medication during the week. Unit leaders must accompany their campers to the Health Lodge for their medications. Please try and bring all your Scouts taking medication at the same time. Additionally, it is the responsibility of the adult leaders, on departure from camp, to collect any medications or herbal supplements from the Health Lodge.

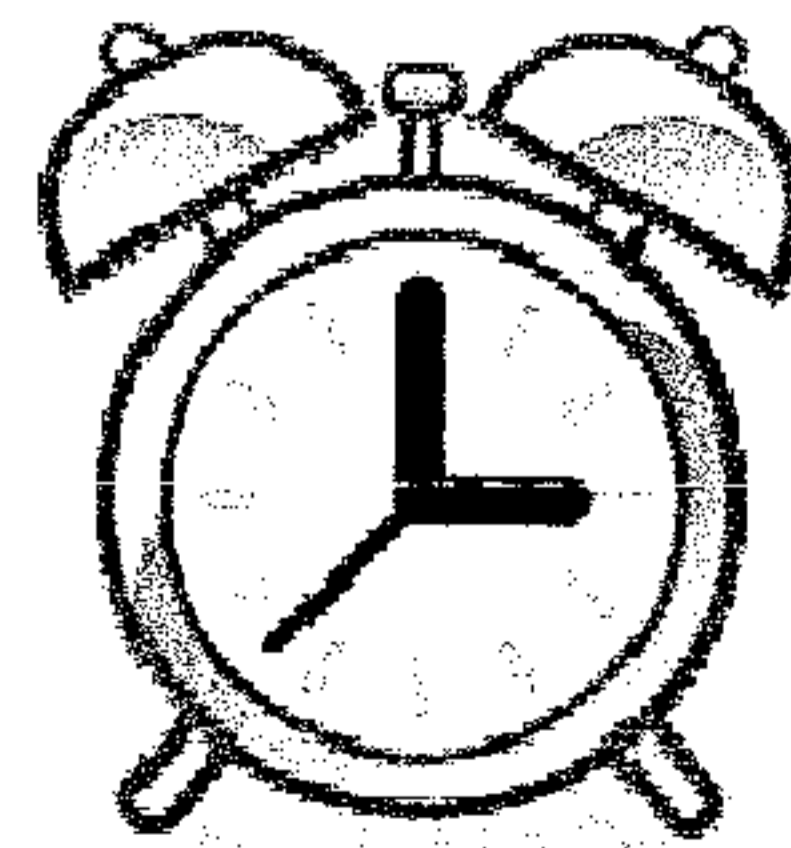
In order to speed up check in please have each scouts parent complete the Medication Dispensing Form. This form will be used to log the medication administered to each person. Appendix 1aHEALTH

Any camper, upon check-in, requiring treatment for a pre-existing condition (i.e., wound care) should bring a note from a doctor or parent, along with the sterile supplies necessary to perform the care, and instructions stating what needs to be done. We are happy to assist so that treatment can take place in a clean environment. Our medical staff will not administer injections.

Special arrangements must be made with medical personnel to receive medications and herbal supplements at any time other than the times posted above.

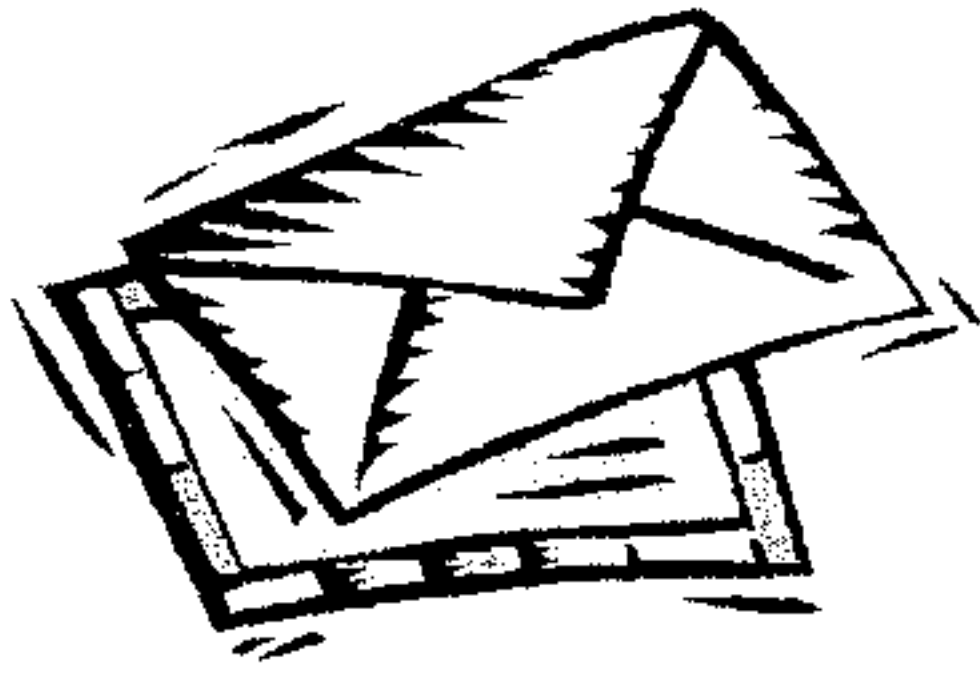

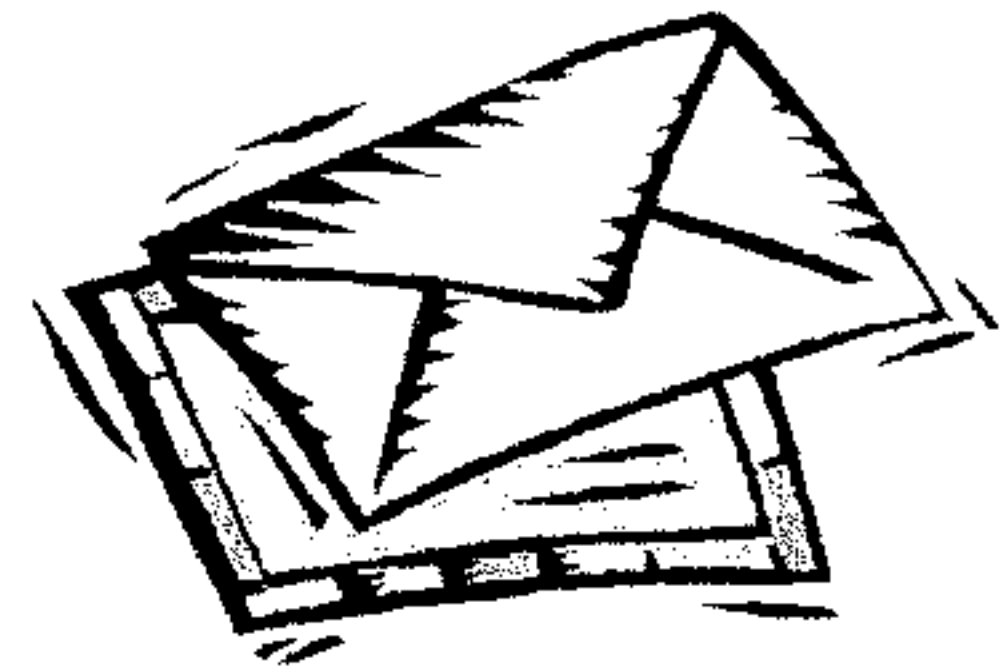
